The word Hanukah comes from the three letter root Khet-Nun-Khaf, the root letters that give us education, training, inauguration and dedication.

When Abraham Joshua Heschel taught at the Center for Jewish Education in Germany in the 1930's, he encouraged people to fight the rise of fascism with spiritual resistance, to resist through education, to resist through the celebration of life and holidays, to train our youth in the words of Torah and the social consciousness of the Hebrew Prophets. In the 1960's, spiritual resistance brought Heschel to Vatican II to help heal centuries of anti Semitic bias coming from the Church. In the 1960's spiritual resistance was married to non violent civil disobedience in the fight against racism and the Vietnam War.

Am Kolel is engaged, more than ever, in spiritual resistance and non violent civil actions to address the growing social, political and environmental threats we face. We rededicate ourselves even more totally to:

- The renewal of Judaism and the Jewish community.
- Responding to social and environmental issues.
- Joining coalitions of response.
- Designing opportunities for civil discourse on sensitive issues:
 - ► American democracy, ► Israel/Diaspora relations and ► Gun reform.
- Providing Judaic resources, counseling and officiating for all lifecycle events.
- Building bridges with non Jewish communities.

Our retreat center continues to be a gem in our collective hat, used by organizations engaged in spiritual growth, social justice and community service.
